We also saw Mrs Ceri Seeley, Vice-Chair, leave us in June. We wish Ceri well and she continues to support the community both in her work and with 'Keep Valley Tidy'. Many congratulations to our fellow councillor Cllr Ken Taylor on his election to the County Council. We welcome new members to the council, and I am sure they will contribute a lot to the community and they have already rolled up their sleeves and got involved with a lot during the summer.

We have now started to meet face to face again after covid, with the option of hybrid too. The last couple of years have been difficult, and I would like to place on record my heartfelt thanks to everyone or a group in the community that have gone over and beyond to ensure that the vulnerable in our community were looked after. I would also like to express my sincere condolences to anyone that has lost a relative or friend in the pandemic.

The feedback I have had over the summer is that the council has moved forward in many ways. It is important that we look at what we need to improve on, set a strategic direction and vision, set priorities and work towards them through working groups and committees. The planning presentation in June was outstanding and there is scope to develop this further. Last year, Cllr Gordon Browne told us that the pupils would like a picnic bench in the park next to the school and we made sure this happened so the young people of our community felt that their views were listened to.

Last year, we made appointing a young representative a priority, and we were successful in appointing one individual to that role. Throughout the next year, we will continue to make this a priority and develop the role further, and look into appointing groups to feedback to the full council.

I think as a council, we are developing to be a good team and it is promising that we are having new members being appointed onto the council. Valley is a vast village split into four wards. There are over 2,700 residents that are on the electoral roll and it is fundamentally important we focus on every corner of the village. We are here to serve, we are one team, and I am sure that the commitment that we show towards our community that we, as a council, will go from strength to strength.

I take my role as Chair seriously and I am absolutely determined to bring the community as a whole as we embark on new challenges. 

- Audit work will commence on the 'took kit' to ascertain what we need to work on to further improve our effectiveness
- Chair, Vice-Chair and Clerk to commence meeting virtually every month to look over agenda and set direction.
