Important things to remember;



- Advise people to contact their suppliers / debtors to discuss their concerns. They have a duty to provide measures to help.
- Remind people to check that they are claiming the benefits they are entitled to - **Benefits calculators - GOV.UK** (www.gov.uk) or **Turn2us Benefits Calculator**
- A lot of the financial support currently available is paid automatically **IF YOU** claim the relevant benefit, and claiming the right benefit makes you eligible for further financial help.
- Help is available to understand what you are entitled to receive and how to claim it **Claim what's yours | GOV.WALES** 0808 250 5700.

Help with fuel costs at home

What is available at the moment?

£400 off the fuel bill – it will be paid / administered by the supplier.

There is **NO NEED** to apply for it (Energy Bill Support Scheme)

Additional cost of living payments for SOME groups of people;

£650 Cost of living payment for those on low income benefit or tax credits

£300 Cost of living payment for pensioners

£150 Cost of living payments for the disabled

You **WILL NOT** be required to apply for these, they will be paid alongside your benefit payment / tax credit:

£150 Warm Homes Discount

To be paid / administered by the supplier as a discount on the bill. Eligible people will receive a letter in November / December 2022 to let them know about it.

There is **NO NEED** to apply.

Cost of Living Support Scheme – Discretionary Phase

Cost of living support scheme (gov.wales).

Some individuals who were excluded from the payments made automatically to those in receipt of Council Tax Reduction earlier in 2022 will receive an automatic payment of £150, check the website for full details.

Winter Fuel Payment

If you were born on or before 25 September 1956 you could get between £250 and £600 to help you pay your heating bills. This is known as a 'Winter Fuel Payment'.

The amount you'll get includes a 'Pensioner Cost of Living Payment'. This is between £150 and £300.

You'll only get this extra amount in winter 2022 to 2023. This is in addition to any **Cost of Living Payment** you get with your benefit or tax credits.

Most payments will be made automatically in November or December. You'll get a letter telling you how much you'll get. If you do not get a letter or the money is not paid into your account by 13 January 2023, contact the **Winter Fuel Payment Centre**



£25 a week Cold Weather Payment

You may get a Cold Weather Payment if you're getting **certain benefits or Support for Mortgage Interest**.

Other Financial support available but **REQUIRED TO APPLY** for:

Cost of Living Support Scheme Discretionary Phase – Hardship/ Crisis Payments

Applications can be made by individuals in crisis directly attributable to the Cost of Living crisis. Eligibility, how to apply and the policy can be found at **Cost of living support scheme (gov.wales)**

£200 One-off Winter Fuel Support Need to apply

Individuals in receipt of Council Tax Reduction should automatically receive a letter with a Unique reference number enabling them to make a claim online, others should check the eligibility criteria and make an application, full details available at **Winter Fuel Support Scheme (gov.wales)**

Limited assistance with off grid fuel available via YMCC Financial Inclusion Team. This is not a renewed fund so assistance will only be available until current funding expires.

Payments or advice to help when someone is in an emergency, such as:

Discretionary Assistance Fund – EAP.
Discretionary Assistance Fund (DAF) | GOV.WALES

£30-£49 emergency fuel voucher for those on a Pre-paid meter / Pay as you go, or Off-grid through the Fuel Bank Foundation. Administered on Anglesey by the Anglesey Foodbank – only available to individuals in crisis being referred for foodbank issue. Help also available from CAB Energy Advisers.

Advise customers to contact their energy suppliers if they are in crisis and about to be disconnected or run out of emergency credit. On occasion suppliers will arrange an emergency top up but customers are usually required to repay in instalments from future top ups.



REQUIRED TO APPLY

What else can i do?

Help people to register for a Priority Service with an energy supplier if they are a resident with a disability, health condition, pensioner, with a child under 5 or pregnant.

Help people make their homes as warm as possible - small changes to energy use, reducing draft, insulation and other measures such as solar panels (through schemes such as ECO and NYTH) for further information see
